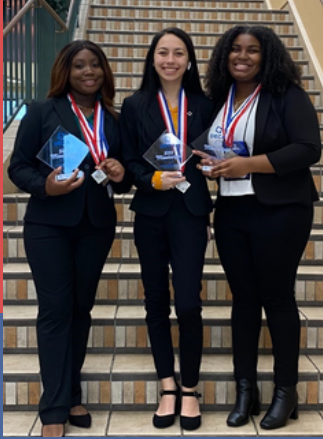

Amelia Buras: Top 10 in the nation in testing and 17th overall out of over 200 students in the Principles of Marketing Event, and the ONLY MS Finalist.

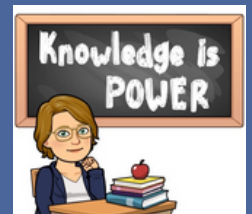


Kailey Middleton: Top 30% in the nation in Hotel and Lodging Management Event

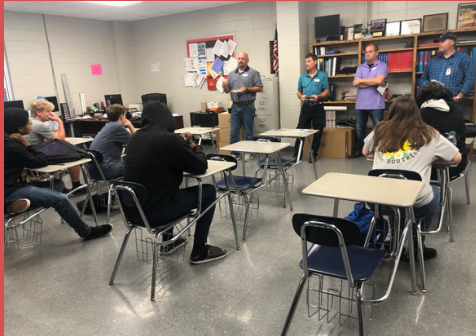
